

Falkland Cricket Club – Privacy and GDPR Statement

Approved by Trustees March 2026. Review required by March 2029.

Falkland CC is a Clubmark registered club, affiliated with Berkshire Cricket and the England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB). The club is the data controller for the purposes of UK data protection laws. The Trustees of the club are responsible for updating this Policy where appropriate and in ensuring its compliance.

Personal data we collect

We may collect and process the following types of personal data:

- Identity Data: eg Full name, date of birth, gender
- Contact Data: eg Address, telephone number, email address
- Emergency Contact Data: eg Name and phone number of next of kin
- Medical Information: eg Relevant medical conditions or allergies (where necessary for safety)
- Membership Data: eg Team participation, coaching qualifications, DBS check records
- Media Data: eg Photographs and videos taken during club activities
- Technical Data (if using our website): eg IP address, browser type, and cookies
- Payments made via the club website may be handled by a third-party processor (eg Stripe/Go Cardless). The club does not store any financial information relating to these transactions.

Our legal basis for collecting and processing your data

Under UK GDPR law, we process personal data under the following lawful bases:

- Consent – eg for using images or videos for promotional purposes, participating in livestreams
- Contractual necessity – eg for processing membership or match/league registrations
- Legal obligation – eg safeguarding or health and safety compliance
- Legitimate interests – eg maintaining club records, promoting events, capturing match highlights, keeping information (top scores, team photos, awards etc) for posterity and historical interest

How we use your information

We use your data to:

- Ensure the safety and wellbeing of participants
- Manage club membership and communications
- Organise matches, training and events
- Allow members and supporters who are not at matches to follow open-age matches via livestream
- Score matches and compile statistics via platforms such as Play Cricket
- Promote the club through newsletters, website, or social media
- Fulfil legal and insurance requirements
- Note - Although no data will be captured with the intention of using it to support disciplinary proceedings, if captured it may be used by the club for this purpose if relevant

Taking and using photos and videos

Subject to other club policies as listed above, we may take photos and videos during matches, training sessions, or social events for various purposes, including:

- Promoting successes of the club on our website, social media, posters, or newsletters
- Creating historical or matchday archives
- Analysing progress and/or performance of cricketers, to enable the planning of player coaching and development

Consent to the provision and use of your information and data

- For Juniors (U18s), in order that we can safely undertake our safeguarding and responsibilities in loco parentis, parents are expected to provide full details for each child, via the Family Membership form. Parents have the opportunity, on the form, to make it known that they do not wish for their child to be in any photos or videos taken by the club, in accordance with the club Photos and Videos policy.
- For adult members, we will request the information and data as listed above, for the purposes of running the club and its activities effectively.
- For all members we will obtain your consent before using identifiable images for promotional use. For U18s, this will be done via parents.
- For adult members we will obtain your consent before matches in which you participate are livestreamed. For U18s participating in open-age cricket, this consent will be gained via parents. Junior matches are not livestreamed.
- You can withdraw your consent at any time by contacting us at cricket@falklandcc.co.uk for open-age players or, where concerning a Junior (U18), safeguarding@falklandcc.co.uk

Consequences of exercising your right not to provide us with personal information or permissions

You do not have to provide us with personal information, or give permission to be a part of visual media including (but not limited to) livestreaming of matches, in order to participate in club activities. Choosing to exercise your right to withhold some permissions or data will have some practical consequences however, including (but not limited to):

- Being able to play only in open-age matches that are NOT livestreamed, which will normally mean preclusion from teams playing in the higher leagues as these matches are livestreamed on a regular basis.
- Being able to make yourself available, and therefore be selected to play in, only the occasional informal match as the vast majority of club matches are arranged via electronic sports management platforms that need the contact information of an individual.

Storage of Photos and Videos:

- Photos and videos are retained only as long as necessary for their intended use, unless retained for archival or historical purposes.
- Upon withdrawal of consent, we will take reasonable steps to remove identifiable media from future use and, where practicable, delete it from storage systems.

Data sharing

We do not sell your data, or share your data with third parties for the purposes of marketing. We may need to share relevant information with other organisations outside the club, eg:

- Governing cricket bodies (e.g., Berkshire Cricket, the ECB) for competition and regulatory requirements
- Service providers (eg Pitchero) who manage our IT, communications, or media systems (under strict confidentiality agreements)
- Local leagues or partner clubs
- Association of Cricket Officials for training and development examples using livestream images

- Emergency and/or Child Protection services if required
- Any other where the club may need to responsibly provide certain information in order to safely and effectively run club activities

Data retention

We retain personal data only for as long as needed:

- Membership data: up to 2 years after leaving the Club
- Emergency and medical information: deleted after each season
- Media content: retained for the duration of its intended use or until consent is withdrawn
- Archived materials: retained for historical or club records purposes, subject to consent and opt-out rights

Data security

We implement appropriate technical and organisational measures to secure your data:

- Password-protected systems
- Limited access to sensitive data
- Regular review and deletion of outdated records
- Encryption and secure backups for digital files

Your rights under UK GDPR

You can find your legal rights as an individual under data protection law in Chapter III of the UK GDPR.

You have the right to:

- Access your data and ask what basic data of yours we keep
- Rectify inaccurate information
- Request erasure of the information we hold relating to you (where no longer necessary or consent is withdrawn)
- Restrict processing of your data in certain circumstances
- Object to certain uses, including direct marketing or promotional media use
- Port your data to another provider where applicable
